Located in the southeast valley of the Phoenix metropolitan area, Gilbert has a high quality of community life fueled by a strong economy. Thriving in business and leisure activities, the community has been named a Best Place to Live in the U.S. Gilbert is within a half a mile of Arizona State University's Polytechnic campus and Chandler-Gilbert Community College and there are more than 69 other colleges, universities and technical schools within a 30- minute commute. Additionally, Gilbert has a nationally A-ranked K-12 system through the public schools and unique magnet and charter programs. Gilbert has an array of homes from urban condos and apartments to starter homes to executive housing with large lots, some for equine enthusiasts.

Gilbert is central to many of Arizona's scenic attractions. To the northeast are the Superstition Mountains, location of the legendary Lost Dutchman's Gold Mine, as well as the Tonto National Forest which features scenery ranging from rugged desert to cool pines. The Riparian Preserve in Gilbert features hiking and equestrian trails and provides an opportunity for wildlife and bird watching.
