With a population of more than 450,000, Mesa, Arizona is the 38th largest city in the United States and second largest in the Phoenix-Mesa metro area. Larger than Miami, Minneapolis, Atlanta and St. Louis, Mesa covers 133 square miles inside a 21-city region with a combined population of 4.3 million, projected to grow to 6.0 million by 2030. Mesa offers a quality urban experience supported by a diversified economic base, excellent educational institutions, business-friendly government, robust utility and transportation infrastructure, and an educated, young workforce.

Mesa is home to the Chicago Cubs during spring training and will soon add the Oakland As. The Phoenix-Mesa metro area is one of only a handful of cities in the nation to host teams in all four major professional sports – Arizona Diamondbacks, Phoenix Suns, Phoenix Coyotes, and the Arizona Cardinals. In the Mesa area you can enjoy year-round sunshine, desert and mountain landscapes, world-class restaurants and shopping, a thriving arts and culture scene, golf courses, hiking trails, fishing, mountain biking, and within close proximity five multi-purpose recreation lakes, pine trees and snow skiing.
